

Flamenco Workshop with Felicia German

September 6 to 11, 2005

Beginner / Intermediate and Intermediate / Advanced levels



Felicia German is a Baltimore native who is currently living in Jerez de la Frontera, Spain performing, teaching and advancing her studies with, among others, Mercedes Ruiz, 2002 *Bienal de Sevilla* dance competition winner, and Ana Maria Lopez with whom she studies flamenco theory. Entering into the world of Flamenco and earning the respect of its native artists, especially in Andalucia, is not an easy task for a foreigner. Felicia has most recently been invited to perform in *La Peña Platería* in Granada with singer Jaime Heredia. She has performed in Jerez and the province of Cadiz with some of the most authentic flamenco Andalusian artists such as singers Luis Vargas “El Mono”, el “Cantarote”, Paco el “Gasolina” and singer Antonio Fajardo as well as being backed by talented guitarists such as Jesus Alvarez, Juan Parilla, and Ishmael Heredia. She is currently dancing in the Parilla gypsy family tablao called “El Laga de Tio Parrilla” and has also danced in La Taberna Flamenca in the gypsy barrio Santiago. In February 2004 she shared the stage with Jerezano of world renown dancers Antonio El Pipa and Maria del Mar Moreno for a benefit performance held in the Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art in Jerez.

She began her studies with Eva Encinias Sandoval, her family and internationally known Spanish dancer Omayra Amaya and throughout the years has studied with such artists as Farruquito, Eva la Yerbabuena, Pilar Ortega, La Meira, Maria Bermudez and Belen Maya. During her years in New Mexico she performed with flamenco dance company *Alma Flamenca* and in 1998 had the honor of sharing the stage with world famous Eva la Yerbabuena in the *Fiesta Flamenca*, of the annual Flamenco Festival in New Mexico. Before moving to Jerez three years ago she was based in Washington DC performing with dance company *Arte Flamenca* and teaching dance in Baltimore. Alongside nationally acclaimed dancers Edwin Aparicio and Anna Menendez she performed in the Kennedy Center in spring 2002.
